

## Addressing the Challenges of Word Poverty, Years 5 to 9.

This flyer is an invitation to both non specialist and specialist Literacy and English practitioners to join a cross phase working group project aimed at addressing the challenges of word poverty in the primary and secondary sectors. It is also an exciting opportunity to improve the word skills of pupils in your school. Furthermore, there is the potential for your school to access Education Endowment Fund (EEF) grants for literacy projects to assist your most vulnerable pupils.

Initially, this meeting will **focus on addressing the challenges faced by many pupils** when working with a more demanding academic curriculum at Key Stages 2 and 3. Moreover, it is becoming increasingly evident that many of our children are clearly not equipped to deal with the sophisticated course content and expanding subject terminology of the new linear GCSE specifications.

The meeting will help teachers:

- ► Understand the background to the **Academic Vocabulary Proposed**Collaborative Project
- Consider the reasons why word poverty or vocabulary deficits occur
- Gain insights into how pupils develop vocabulary
- Understand the importance of vocabulary building
- ► Assess the relevance of the **AWL** (Academic Word List) and **consider its use** in cross phase schools
- Consider whole school approaches and strategies to closing the vocabulary gap.

By the end of this initial meeting, it is envisaged that participating institutions will become part of an action group of leading schools that will drive forward literacy initiatives designed to address the issue of word poverty.
